### Around the Classes

It has been a fun-filled, festive month in **Junior Infants** as the children have been preparing for Christmas. The play and learn theme this month was 'Santa's Workshop'. The children were very creative as they designed and made toys in the construction zone. They had great fun in the role play and small world zones, taking on the roles of Santa and the elves as they made and delivered toys for Christmas. In the creative zones, the children made snow globes and Christmas trees, while in the junk art zone they practised wrapping presents. In maths, the children focused on data, collecting and sorting information about their favourite Christmas movies and songs, and they also learned about the number formation of 1 and 2. The children especially enjoyed learning about simple coding and directional language as they used Bee-Bots in festive-themed activities. In Irish, the children learned about An Nollaig, and in English they continued to learn their Jolly Phonics sounds. They have also been singing lots of Christmas songs and enjoying all the festive cheer in the classroom. I hope everyone in Junior Infants has a wonderful Christmas and enjoys a well-deserved















Senior Infants have continued their hard work this month, as well as covering some interesting and fun topics in play and learn. They have been writing more and more, starting to form sentences and working really hard on their finger spaces and sounding words out. They have been working on the 'magic e' and looking at other alternate sounds that might be used. In their play and learn topics they looked at farms, making handprint chicks, setting up and playing with the farm small world, as

well as writing stories inspired by the story of Farmer Duck and What the Ladybird Heard. The class then turned their attention to winter, thinking about the Arctic and the animals that live there. The children loved learning all about Arctic foxes, polar bears and more. They did some beautiful art using paints to make the Northern Lights and drawing polar bears to go on the top. Since then, they have been immersing themselves in Christmas themed activities! The children have loved doing role play in the post office posting cards, and in Santa's workshop - making, wrapping and delivering presents! They made some great Christmas cards, and have also been working hard on learning the songs for the Carol Service. In maths they looked at collecting data onto bar charts, partitioning numbers out and looking at the properties of some 3D shapes. A massive well done to all of Senior Infants on a fantastic first term. I hope you all have a lovely restful break, and a very Merry Christmas.









December has been a very busy and exciting month in 1st Class! In maths, the children have been learning all about ordinal numbers and place value, using fun activities and games to help them understand these new concepts. In English, they have been working very hard on improving their handwriting and learning how to write full sentences. The children have shown great pride in their written work and have made fantastic progress. Tá an Nollaig ag teacht! In Irish, they have been learning all about Christmas vocabulary and traditions through songs, stories, and oral language. They have been very creative in art this month. The children decorated beautiful Christmas candles, created magical winter wonderland scenes, and spent lots of time carefully working on their entries for the Christmas colouring competition. In science, they have been learning all about winter, including the difference between evergreen and deciduous trees, and observing how nature changes during this season. In geography, the children learned about Irish seals and how to tell the difference between grey seals and harbour seals, which they found fascinating. In history, they learned about the famous author Hans Christian Andersen and enjoyed retelling our favourite stories that he wrote. 1st Class have also really enjoyed practising their songs for the Christmas service, and the children have shown great enthusiasm and confidence while singing. In SPHE, they learned about teamwork and the importance of being an upstander to bullying rather than a bystander, helping us to be kind and supportive classmates. They are all feeling very festive and so excited for Christmas! Ms Dodds hopes all the children have wonderful, happy, and restful Christmas break, and will miss them in the new year!











2nd Class enjoyed a festive month of December. Their main focus was the Christmas nativity play which took place on the 12th of December. 3rd Class have been busy and enthusiastic learners in December! In maths, pupils explored the very practical topics of money and time, enjoying lots of hands-on games and problem-solving activities through fun and interactive maths stations. In English, the class learned all about idioms and had great fun playing rebus games. Ms. Hoffman was especially impressed by their excellent word knowledge and strong puzzle-solving skills. In Gaeilge, pupils worked on the topics "An Aimsir" and "An Nollaig", with a particular focus on improving their pronunciation while reading. Their confidence and accuracy are growing all the time. In SESE they were excited to find out about life in 'Yakutsk' one of the coldest cities in the world. They were inspired to continue their research into cold places and completed amazing projects on Polar regions. Through engaging with the projects, the pupils developed research skills, critical thinking and organisational skills as well as how to work well with a partner. In PE, they completed their first module of swimming lessons in PSLC and have begun GAA skills with our new coach Jason. In art they made origami houses and drew amazing pictures for the annual Christmas picture competition. They had great fun doing a STEM challenge of Make the Longest Paper Chain from one piece of paper. They performed their songs and readings beautifully at the carol service and helped to act out scenes from the Nativity to accompany the celebration. It has been a fantastic term for 3rd Class & the special outing to Wonderlights was a fitting reward for all the great effort and









December may have been a short month, but it was certainly packed with fun, learning, and excitement in 4th Class! In Gaeilge, they learned all about 'An Nollaig' and enjoyed reading beautiful seasonal stories as Gaeilge, including the lovely tale An Chéad Oíche Nollag. The children really enjoyed exploring the language through festive themes and stories. In maths, they began working more closely

with their tables, and the children have been putting in fantastic effort preparing for their Friday guiz each week. They also studied multiplication and division with larger numbers, and it has been wonderful to see their confidence and determination growing every day. For science, 4th Class studied the brain, integrating our learning with wellbeing. The children learned about the prefrontal cortex and the amygdala, and how to recognise and manage an amygdala hijack. This led to some great discussions about emotions, self-control, and looking after their mental health. Creativity was in full swing as they took part in an art competition, with some very special and thoughtful entries produced by the class this year. A huge part of our December was dedicated to preparing for our incredible Christmas play, What Christmas Means to Me. The teamwork shown by the class was truly outstanding. From choreography and costume ideas to prop design and performance, every child played an important role. The dedication, collaboration, and enthusiasm were a joy to witness. The show was an absolute treat to watch, and most importantly, the children loved every minute of it. It was a wonderful way to finish the term and a moment everyone in 4th Class will remember fondly.



December was a really fun and busy month in 5<sup>th</sup> Class. They started GAA in Bridgefield which the class are enjoying.
