



They started the Skip Around Europe challenge which is a fantastic whole school incentive organised by The Active School to promote fitness, wellbeing and team work amongst primary schools all around the country. In maths they have been focusing on shape and space mainly the area and perimeter of a shape or a space. They had a lot of fun estimating and comparing different objects around the classroom and different shaped rooms around the school. They also put a lot of focus on their place value in maths, adding with regrouping and ensuring they have mastered their tower sums into their copybooks using their very best presentation. English lessons focused mostly on grammar this month. Learning how to stretch a sentence using adverbs and adjectives to make them more interesting. All fantastic tools to have in preparation for our short story competition coming up over the next few weeks. They had fun with clay making Easter bunnies and they explored the Easter Story in religion and also different Easter traditions celebrated all over the world. The class had fun learning some new vocabulary in Gaeilge lessons all based around 'An Teilifís'. April has been another great month for learning in 3rd Class! The class continued focusing on the theme of transport and used this to help create some amazing pieces of work! This included writing some fantastic descriptive pieces that revolved around a journey to a tropical island. They learnt about and used expanded noun phrases, figurative language and interesting adjectives to make their writing as descriptive as possible! The

class were very proud of their work! They also used great teamwork and digital

literacy skills to create ebooks on the iPads. Their topic was famous explorers from the past such as Christopher Columbus, Neil Armstrong and Amelia Earhart! The children put in a great effort to add details like voiceovers, interesting images and funky fonts to make their ebooks really stand out! In science the class learnt about how planes fly. This included learning about the forces of air resistance, up thrust, drag and gravity. To help with their understanding we undertook an investigation to

find out which paper airplane design was the best! In groups, the children created 3

prototypes to use. They showed great predicting, recording and analysing skills to find out which airplane flew the furthest! In maths, they learnt how to read, interpret and use timetables to plan journeys. They took part in lots of problem-solving activities that helped build their real-life maths skills! In Gaeilge, they have been learning all about 'Éadaí'. They have made a great effort to learn new words, phrases and use more Gaeilge i rith an lae! The class

have made great progress and produced some brilliant written pieces about their favourite outfits! In art, 3<sup>rd</sup> class continued to have Ms. Hoffman teach them some beautiful

art techniques that helped them create some amazing Easter and spring art! They have really enjoyed having her in with us! Finally, 3<sup>rd</sup> class completed their Stay Safe program in April. The class had some great discussions on topics such as bullying, secrets and touches and even acted out some very impressive role-plays! Well done on a brilliant month 3<sup>rd</sup> Class!

The class created and displayed some beautiful spring art this month. In maths, the class learned how to draw circles using compasses and also learned how to label the different parts of the circle. 5<sup>th</sup> class worked on the theme of 'An Aimsir' in Gaeilge and they practised lots of phrases to describe the different types of weather that we experience through the different seasons.









6th Class took part in the An Post initiative 'Letter to My Future Self' and wrote letters to themselves which will be posted back to them in May 2026! The class were working on their public speaking and made speeches in front of the class on their ideal job. Ms. Hoffman was delighted to see everybody in the class take part and speak confidently in front of their peers. In P.E they are practising relays and sprints in athletics to prepare for the upcoming Cuman na mBunscoile event in Santry next month. They have been really enjoying the Skip Around Europe challenge! In geography they explored the idea of developing and developed countries and compared them in relation to industry, employment & education.
