
The month of June has passed by in the blink of an eye! 2nd Class have been non-stop learning and exploring this month. They have revised



dampen their spirits! Mr. Jones hopes everyone in 3rd class has an absolutely amazing summer and wishes them all the very best in 4th class!







What a busy and exciting few weeks it's been in 5th Class! Here's a roundup of all the




